THE HARMONIC BALANCER

The harmonic balancer we know, fitted to the front end of the crankshaft, was developed by much work by Dr. Frederick Lanchester, resulting in a patent granted to him in 1924 & was fitted to his 26 horsepower & later to a Vauxhaull 23/60.

It was a device driven by the crankshaft at twice the engine speed to absorb the variations in speed of the crankshaft from the twisting of the crankshaft along it's length which lead to breakages, particularly in long length eight cylinder engines.

The balancer was not a success because of it's wear at high speeds, doubling that of the crankshaft.

The balance problem was therefore well known to both Lanchester & Henry Royce.

Lanchester later devised a two disc like clutch arrangement that arrested the uneven revolutions of the shaft where the clutch damped the speed to the front disc.

Move forward now to 1949 when a scientist, Leonard Mullins who specialized in the properties of rubber, discovered what was named "the Mullins effect". His research revealed the elastic behaviour of rubber in which rubber can stretch & spring back & stretch again the second time owing to the makeup of the internal molecules in the rubber.

This important discovery led to the manufacture of engine mounts & the harmonic balancer we know today. Metalistic bushes embody this characteristic also.

The solution that Lanchester & Royce sought was now achieved. This brilliant Englishman, Mullins is today largely unknown.

Some of the balancers have deteriorated due to hardening & cracking of the rubber between the discs as with some engine & gearbox mounts, usually saturated with oil. These rubbers can be replaced by specialist firms & two club car's rear mounts have recently been replaced.

The High Tea was served on the traditional three tiered stands and there was a fine selection of scones (two types, pumpkin and plain), butter, cream and jam, finger sandwiches, mini quiches, and gorgeous little patisserie standard cakes and macaron as well as your choice of a wide range of teas, coffee or hot chocolate.



If one was feeling decadent a glass of Jansz sparkling wine was on offer for a modest price.


