DAIMLER RUN TO GOULBURN WATERWORKS

We met as usual at Pheasants Nest and thought we were in Millionaires Row – there was a line up of Lamborghini, McLarens and a Porsche.

Present were Graham and Joan, Chris and John, Alan and Carolyn and Liz and Kevin. We collected lan Fletcher on the way and met Paul and Meg at the venue along with Paul's sister Heather and partner David over from the U.K. They were heading to Canberra for an overnight stay.

Set in a picturesque spot on the Wollondilly River, this was an interesting and historic place housing the Goulburn Waterworks.

The Goulburn Waterworks was built between 1883 and 1885 to supply water to the Goulburn township. The original steam engine was an Appleby Bros. Beam Engine being made in England and is the only remaining one in the world. The boiler to provide

steam to run the pump was fired 24 hours a day, 7 days a week so the fireman lived on site in the Fireman's Cottage. Mainly timber was burnt with a little coal as well.

In 1918 an electric driven Kelly and Lewis pump was installed and operated along with the steam pump until 1932 when a Clyde Centrifugal electric pump took over. The waterworks continued operations until 1977.

After looking our fill we took off to Rosies Café for a delicious lunch.

Tummies full it was time to inspect the roses and art at the Goulburn Soldiers Club, a short walk across the park.

Kevin and I departed at this point but I am sure the others enjoyed the displays.

THE MIDDLETON FAMILY MK11 CENTURY

Dad built the sixteen foot inboard runabout in his garage at five dock 1968/69. From 1970 to 1978 many a Father & Son fishing adventure was enjoyed.

I understand there was only one owner from 1957 to 1963 when Dad bought the car, who must have lived in a country area. Every time one hit a solid bump, red dust would filter out of the roof lining. I remember Dad having the underside & engine bay steam cleaned, red sludge everywhere!

My first drive was in December 1963 around Centennial Park in Sydney, 20 years old, & Oh so different from my 1948 Morris 8/40!

In 1978 I did a considerable amount of Mechanical work on the car. The metallic grey had deteriorated so I had the car resprayed white. From 1978 to 1988 she spent most of these years outdoors in all types of weather, either at Five Dock or near the harbour at Birchgrove.

During part of this period, & needing extra income, I did handyman work for neighbours & friends on the weekends. Having no other vehicle, I took out the front passenger seat, the back seats & dividing panel into the boot. One could get quite a length of timber through the front windows to the opposite corner of the boot, not to mention several boxes of tools, bags of cement & sundry other items needed for a specific job. To complete the picture a roof rack with ladders & other lengthy items. My trusty English pointer, "Cyprian" sitting next to me on tool boxes thinking this is all great fun.

Needs be as they were, but I don't recommend to other Daimler owners after fifty two years in the family "ELIZA" deserves some respect these days & is now back in one piece.

CYRIL M SIMPSON

Who is Cyril Simpson? As time passes, Men & women like him, fade into obscurity.

Cyril Simpson was Daimler Chief Engineer, succeeding in the middle Thirties, one of the giants of English motor engineering, Lawrence M Pomeroy. Who later became Managing Director of Daimler.

By the early to mid-thirties the range of sleeve valve engines that Pomeroy designed were being phased out & on his retirement from Daimler about 1933 Cyril Simpson became the Chief Engineer. He was responsible with others in introducing the poppet OHV engine that replaced the Sleeve valve one circa 1934.

Simpson was previously employed by the Sunbeam Company & was responsible for the large six & eight cylinder engines used in armoured vehicles in the Second World War & after being modified for the post war DE 27 & the eight Cylinder model. All the other post war models were of his design

& continued up to the days when Edward Turner became Chief designer, Managing Director.

Edward Turner, Cyril Simpson & Jack Wickes produced the SP250 to Edward Turner's beautifully designed Vee Eight engine.


Cyril Simpson's design work is under acknowledged & sadly he is largely unknown for the many models he designed.

Some years ago, 1986, I wrote to Mr Brian Smith, Daimler Historian to enquire if he could assist me with information about Mr Simpson & the reply to my letter (shown opposite) reveals the modesty of Mr Simpson, one of the engineering greats of Britain. PART SEVEN - REPAIRING THE REAR GUARDS AND FITTING THE REAR BUMPER AND SPARE TYRE DOOR

The rear bumper bar only had a small dent on the passenger side, which was easily knocked back out.

The new inner panels on the rear had to be recessed to provide clearance for the bumper mounts.

It was encouraging to see everything fitting so well despite all the rust repairs required to the rear end.




Figure 8 - Bumper bar fits well around the body

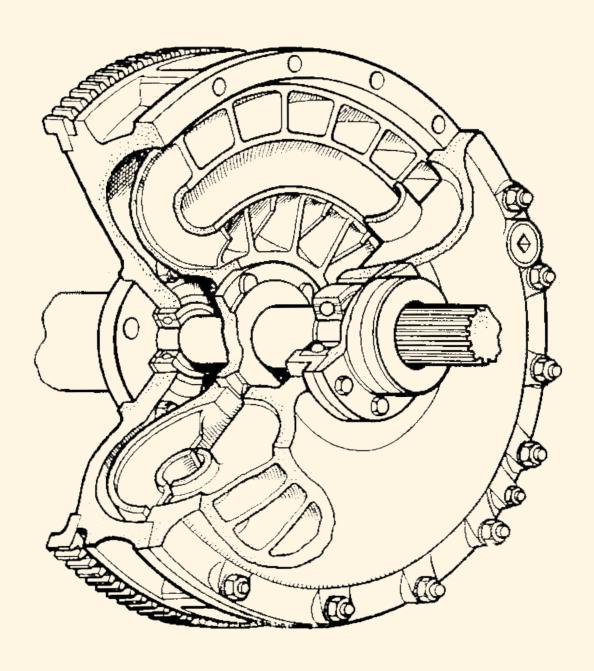
