

THE BUS CC 271

There are photos of this bus in the magazine and a story, as compiled by Malcolm Nixon the owner and restorer, is summarised below.

To start with, Malcolm had a chassis, wheels, radiator surround and a broken motor. Being a 1912 model, the motor was a 4 cylinder sleeve valve and needed the remaking of the sleeves and conrods as well as getting new rings and pistons, among other things. There was no body but photos of a similar vehicle were available.

By searching the internet, Malcolm found that Daimler had built about 560 of these buses from 1912-14 and this is now the only remaining one in running condition. There is another in England but with no motor. Perhaps Malcolm would like to make him one!

Co-incidentally in 1912 the Melbourne Motor Omnibus Co was formed and ordered a Daimler CC bus which arrived in November complete with body. This is the one Malcolm has restored. It was rated at 40hp with silent chain gearing system and a worm type diff. The brakes were on the rear wheels only and the tyres were solid rubber, and at maximum speed of 18mph claimed 9 mpg. The price was a modest 1250 pounds.

Then calamity; war was declared and all vehicles at the Daimler factory and elsewhere were commandeered. 1185 buses went to war but only 250 returned, but Melbourne had secured its fleet of 7 Daimlers and a few other makes. The average mileage reported in 1914 was 34,000 each.

Malcolm has the bus street registered to carry 11 passengers, and in turn we all availed ourselves of a ride around the block. In the yard is an old steam tractor which is Malcolm's next project – maybe.

An amazing talent.



Denis Leys PART EIGHTEEN PART EIGHTEEN - RESTORING THE HEATER AND BLOWER

The heater matrix had a coating of rust on the cover and the aluminium base was heavily oxidised Removing the cover is as easy as undoing two spring clips.

The air flow through the heater is controlled by two geared rotating cylinders mounted in a cast aluminium frame. After thorough cleaning, all moving parts were lubricated and re assembled.

The blower mechanism is a substantial unit in its own right and is also made from cast aluminium.

The repainted and reassembled unit looks very impressive – the mechanism is a work of art.

IN REPLY FROM DEAR LADY NORAH (DOCKER)

Dear Richard, in reply to your question in the magazine, if your speedo/cable/drive gear are operating satisfactorily there is no reason why the speedo needle should swing 'wildly'; in fact it shouldn't swing at all. If the inner cable is lubricated, rotates freely and is free from tight bends and assuming the cable's square drives aren't damaged it's possible the teeth of the speedo drive gear in the gearbox are worn. The remedy is obvious. If the gears are OK it's possible the speedo itself is the problem, although less likely. As you say, the cable rotates a flat magnet inside the speedo which is encircled by a close fitting aluminium disc to which is attached a shaft carrying the needle. As the magnet spins it induces an EMF in the aluminium disc which causes it to rotate with the magnet, the hair spring preventing it from rotating freely. When the EMF and the hairspring forces oppose each other equally the needle should be steady; when the car accelerates the increased EMF rotates the needle's shaft until the hairspring balances the new force set up by the EMF, and vice-versa. The shaft's lower bearing is held centrally by a small drilling in the rotor that carries the magnet, so if dust or dirt gets in here it can cause problems. These AC speedos are fairly simple to strip and clean - much easier than Smiths speedos which are a work of art - so don't be put off at the thought! Definitely don't use grease on the needle shaft, use a tiny drop of light machine oil.

To summarise, there is little or no instability in the system so don't use a damper on the needle staff for 2 reasons: 1) It's not necessary and 2) it would mean the speedo would need to be recalibrated.

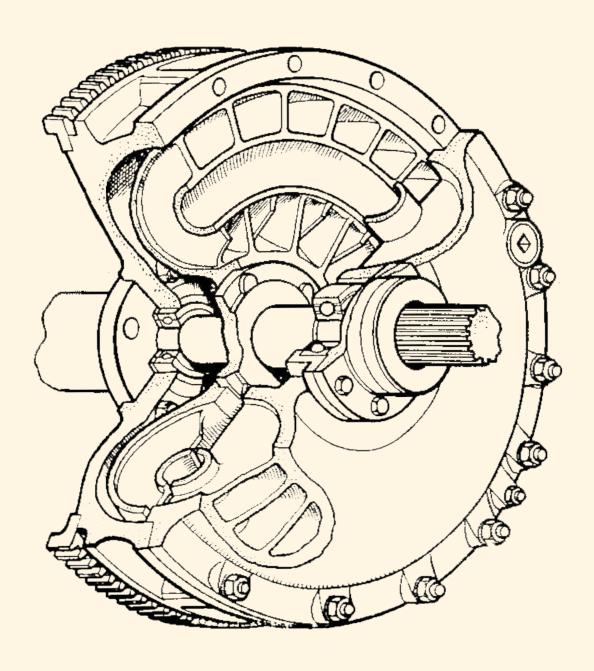
