
The volunteers manning the Museum are wonderful, lovely people with stories to tell and with a warm welcome to visitors.

Option 1:

Meet at McDonalds Mt Colah (513-517 Pacific Highway) for coffee &/or a pitstop.

Depart at 10:30am, following the Old Pacific Highway (B83) via Peats Ridge to Central Mangrove. This should take 50-60 minutes, and leave time to view the cars on arrival at 11:30am, prior to our luncheon booking at 12 noon. Note: Painting maintenance is being carried out on the old Hawkesbury River bridge, so a short section of single lane traffic may be in operation on the bridge on the day, but it should not cause too much delay, as traffic volume is usually light.

We will provide more detailed directions on the day, but essentially we follow the B83 and signs to Peats Ridge, then take the left sweep onto George Downes Dr, towards Central Mangrove, turn right at the intersection with Wisemans Ferry Rd, and then turn left into Hallards Rd, the golf club is just up the road on the right.

PART THIRTY ONE

PART THIRTY ONE - REAR SUSPENSION

I dismantled the springs and found them badly rusted. They cleaned up well enough in vinegar to be finished off with a wire brush. I fitted new threaded bushes to the springs before reassembling them with a smear of copper grease between each leaf.

The springs were painted in black epoxy after reassembly. The rear spring hanger bush on the car was worn so I replaced it with the hanger and shaft of my spares car. I fitted the differential from my 1950's car which I restored 25 years ago.

Refitting the spring on a bare chassis in the absence of the vehicles weight is a lot harder, and I had to make longer U bolts which I made to pull the springs into place.

The dampers were also fitted with new rubber bushes by using the damper link pins as a mandrel. Refitting the cleaned and resealed petrol tank completes the rear end.

THE LANCHESTER PROJECT

April 26 visit - As promised in the last update the Lanchester interior and boot areas have now been vacuumed out. However, before this was done, Merv and I wire brushed, scraped and sanded most surfaces to remove any surface rust, loose paint, glue and/or felt (soundproofing). After the vacuuming Merv then painted all exposed metal or surface rust areas with rust converter. There has been some impressive previous rust repairs done in the rear boot quarters by someone who really knows how to weld. The above work took a large part of our day there, but we took advantage of the remaining part of the day searching through the car parts in Russell's shed and we can advise we have now located all the window and door lock mechanisms.

May 3 visit - On this visit Jim started the panel beating process required before painting. Jim has removed the dent from the rear passenger's side sill and panelled out the dent over the driver's side rear wheel arch. Jim also stated applying the necessary thin filler layer over the wheel arch repaired damage to permit final levelling. Although I had vacuumed out the car in the previous week Jim's work has loosed more dust and blasting grit so I will need to re-vacuum the car probably more than once again as work progresses.

Whilst Jim did the panel beating, Merv and I removed all the components attached to the fire wall to permit correct painting. The engine side of the fire wall had been painted in a dark metallic green, which Jim advises in fact should be black. Don't know how you would remove and replace the heater box with the guards and bonnet in place unless you were a contortionist. We also sanded the fire wall down and I washed it and some of the chassis all down with an initial water rinse.

May 10 visit - Left to our own devices this week Merv and I got stuck into painting the fire wall interior and boot area black as Jim advised. Merv was keen for me to experience the effort required in masking off before painting and surprisingly this took most of the morning for me to complete whilst Merv continued with exterior panel repairs. We had lunch and then Merv started painting. The wind had come up and it was difficult work for Merv and unfortunately he ran out of paint before finishing the boot area. Whilst Merv painted, I cleaned the inner guards hopefully to get them painted as they had been scratched during transit. Unfortunately we encountered problems with Russell's compressor plus a shortage of paint halted our work for the day.

May 17 visit - Jim was back with Merv and I for this visit and his expertise in panel repairs was utilised in further straightening and removing minor dents in both sides door sills. I must say both Jim and Merv have a great eye for picking defects in the bodywork, especially at this stage as everything is in primer grey.

THE LANCHESTER PROJECT

Using an airless spray gun, Merv finished off painting black the boot and some interior areas including the battery cover. See photos. I got to work re-installing all the components we had taken off the fire wall prior to painting, after first cleaning the threads of all the bolts and screws. As I suspected re-installing the fan and heater box was difficult even with Merv's help and I was extremely grateful that the inner and outer guards were not in position.

May 24 visit - Again Merv and I were left to work on the Lanchester alone. In fact Merv did the most work on the car today by a mile, as I had decided to try and rectify the problems with Russell's compressor. By lunch time Merv had sanded back the whole passenger's side sill to a smooth level surface and had only found one small area that will require further levelling before re-priming. I too had achieved success with rectifying the main problem with Russell's compressor although it seems he may need a new combination regulator/pressure gauge/water catcher as it has developed a slow leak at the gauge. The afternoon passed quickly and Merv did more rubbing back on the rear driver's side wheel arch and we both managed to finish up some of our now painted areas.

In the next update we hope to advise a fix has been effected for the stuck in-gear problem and possibly be close to advising a date for the car being ready for painting. 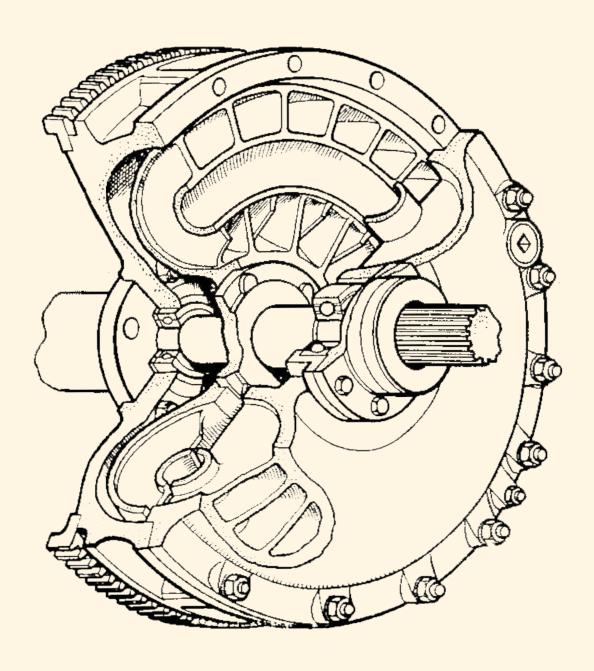
