


There being no further business the meeting was declared closed at 9.20 p.m.

Denis Leys PART TWENTY FIVE PART TWENTY FIVE - RESTORING DASHBOARD CONTROLS

There are many plastic related parts on the dashboard which deteriorate over time. Some lose their lustre and others start to disintegrate. In my case the plastic material surrounding warning light bezels, were beyond repair.

I made new surrounds in my lathe using a nylon type material called Delrin. Although the finish is not the same as the originals, they look much better than the old ones.

The various controls on the dashboard such as switches and cables have dark brown plastic components which oxidise over time and become lighter in colour and generally dull. These components can be easily restored using polish and a bit of elbow grease. The result is directly related to the amount of time you spend polishing.

I also decided to refresh both the regulator and fuse box covers from the engine bay as they were also looking rather drab. The effort was worth it. When doing a full restoration, a little extra time spent on parts like these can make a big difference to the overall look of the vehicle.

ARTICLE FROM SUN NEWSPAPER - FEB 1937

LANCHESTER & DAIMLER LOCAL MARKETING PLANS

THE beginning of motoring history is recalled by the fact that an agency has been established in Sydney for the marketing of Lanchester and Daimler cars.

Though the inevitable dispute exists, as to who really originated the internal combustion engine, the distinction is generally accorded to Gottlieb Daimler.

From his successful attempts to produce a motor car, sprang the Mercedes in Germany, the Panhard in France, and the Daimler in Great Britain. Modern transport by air, land and sea owe much of their origin to this source.

As time went on, the Daimler, Lanchester, and B.S.A. enterprises, in Great Britain fused in the one concern; and to them are attributed the first British motor boat, British petrol car with four wheels, British magneto-fired engine, sleeve-valved engine, rear-axle worn drive, epicyclic gear-change, motor vehicle with four-wheel brakes, and motor car hydraulic coupling.

A record such as this naturally directs particular interest to the latest models just landed of the Lanchester Roadrider, Daimler Fifteen series, and the Daimler Light Straight Eight.

Bodywork and mechanical details in these cars provide evidence of particularly high standard of design and workmanship, aimed at producing a "quality" type of motoring and long, reliable service.

FLUID FLYWHEEL

Attention is being directed at the moment particularly, to the Lanchester, known as the "Fourteen" Roadrider, though actually its rating exceeds that figure. The six-cylinder engine of this car has overhead valves operated by rockers and push rods from a chain-driven camshaft, designed, according to specifications, for exceptionally quiet running and abnormal tolerance in tappet adjustment. Coil ignition, with automatic advance, are employed, and in keeping with modern practice, the engine is mounted on rubber.

Possibly the most interesting feature Is the Daimler fluid flywheel transmission, embodied in these cars, in partnership with a pre-selective four-speed epicyclic gearbox. Absence of the conventional gear-lever naturally improves the accommodation in the front compartment. Any gear may be pre-selected by moving a small lever on the steering column, and brought

into operation merely by depressing and then releasing a pedal which normally would have to be operated simultaneously with the gear lever.

Risks of clashing the gears are thus eliminated, and the fluid flywheel then takes up the task of ensuring smooth engagement and transmission of power.

Here clutch plates with friction surfaces, are replaced by a driving and a driven member, operating in a casing nearly full of oil. By an arrangement of grooves and vanes, the oil is propelled by centrifugal force from the member driven by the engine to the driven member, by which it is returned.

Thus, without actual mechanical contact, a resilient force is applied to transmission of the drive. The two members are sturdily constructed, and as the only intermediary force is oil, should be practically free from wear.

Wheelbase of the Roadrider Is 103 inches, and the track 48 inches.

My name is Frank Wilson I live in Donnybrook in WA, I own a 1973 Daimler DS 420 which until about a year ago was registered as a hire veh and used to provide transport to Weddings, School Balls etc., the car has been unused in my garage for the past year, it is now on private WA plates, I am keen to sell the car but as I'm sure you will be aware its a very limited market. I wondered if you could advertise it amongst your members. The car is in good mechanical condition, although the electrics could do with some attention some of the wiring is showing its age and is rather brittle, the interior generally is ok but a little worn I believe it all to be original, the body and paintwork is good but there is some rust appearing on the bottom of the doors, the car is burgundy and black in colour.

LOOKING FOR A PROJECT?

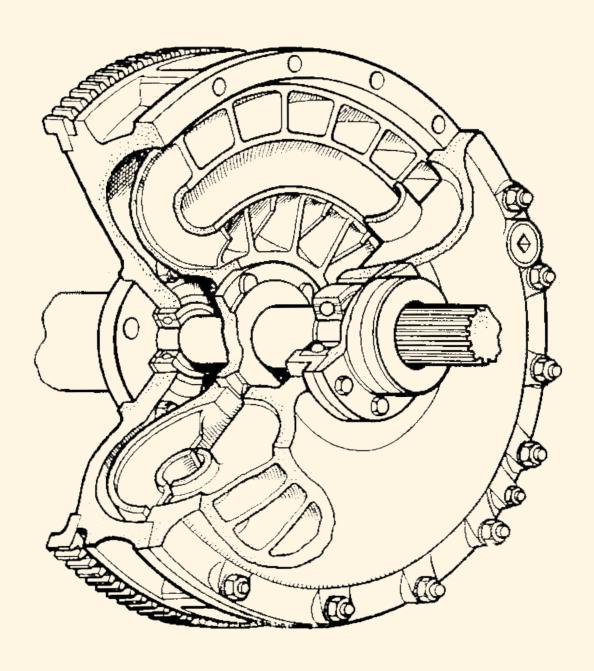
