


Graham and Jenny Norman from Queensland drove down in a modern to visit and it was a real treat to catch up again.

I urge all members to keep the day free next year and join us for a really wonderful day both vehicular and social!







PART TWELVE - REPAIRING AND FITTING THE RADIATOR SURROUND AND GRILL

The radiator surround has heavy salt air corrosion so I will be using the one from my spares car.

The cracks in the 1949 shell are appear to be to be a common problem. The same cracks are also in the spare shells that I have.

Placing rusted metal in a bath of white vinegar for about one week completely removes the rust, and loosens any remaining paint.

I used silver solder to repair the cracks in the shell and normal solder to re-attach the mounting points for the grill.





There are other additions under consideration and details will be announced when the registration information is sent out in October.


