EDWARD V111 AND WALLIE

You will have read the story in the May magazine, sent in by member Peter Pitt from an article in a Highlife magazine of 2001. However let me embellish the story by re-writing the articles I wrote back in 1995 and 6.

It was May 1995 that Leonie Knapman rang me to ask about a big old Daimler that she described. Leonie grew up in the little town of Glen Davis, 120 miles west of Sydney, but was now living in Mittagong and writing a history of that town which had been opened up to mine for shale oil. Leonie was a school girl at the time and remembered riding on the front bumper to the street corner on the way to school. The owner of the car was Chris Westgarth who was in partnership with her father in one of the mines, but Leonie had lost touch with them and wanted some information to put in her book.

The car, so described, was unknown to the club but I put a small article in the magazine calling for help. Bill Stewart immediately contacted me to say he knew the car as he had worked at Hercules Motors (Daimler agent) and had been sent with his boss to Glen Davis to replace the head. Meanwhile Leonie had advertised in the local papers for any

information, and sure enough, this was answered by Jim Hill who had worked on the car at the NRMA garage.

Now how did we get from Glen Davis to Bowral, and for this we need to do a bit of history.

Daimler had the Royal patronage and the latest models were often touted to the Royals. In fact Edward V111 had had a V26 delivered to the Mews early in his reign. Two more were produced and sent to Stratstones (Daimler agent) for display, one being a regular Hooper bodied limousine and the other an American styled body by James Young of Bromley. In fact it had Buick front guards and sidelights. However abdication came about and the cars became available for sale.

Early in 1937 Sir George Davis, who founded the shale oil industry in Glen Davis and was chairman of Davis Gelatine, visited his brother in England. He took his car for service at Stratstones which was at the time these cars were for sale. Sir George bought one of them, drove it across Europe to Estonia to look into their shale oil business and purchase of mining equipment, and then returned to Australia with the car.

In 1947 the car was sold to Chris Westgarth, but after a few years the shale oil business was not viable so in 1952 he and his family moved to Newcastle, and two years later he and a friend took off for the southern highlands in search of work. On reaching Bowral the car broke down, the diff having run out of oil and destroying the worm drive. The car then remained at the NRMA garage awaiting parts from England, the wrong bits being sent and local manufacture then being employed. After all this time the car wouldn't start due to sticking valves and with a bill for \$280 to fix it, Westgarth walked away taking the silverware and decanters from the rear cabinets with him.

And so it was time to ring Leonie and pay a visit to Mittagong with Bill. Leonie arranged for Jim the mechanic to be there too. His story was that the back seat had been removed to house greyhounds, but this was later repudiated by the family, suggesting that it had been removed to get at the diff. The car had been repaired and sold to a local farmer from Moss Vale for \$25 who was "gunna" do it up. This never happened and it sat in the farmer's front yard next to a Fiat tractor for two years, slowly having bits taken from it before being taken over the road to the tip, about 1965. We crossed the road and stood on Wallie's grave, which then was vacant land for sale by Hookers, but now is covered with houses.

At this stage we did not know which of the two cars it was, but Leonie had heard that Sir George's nephew, Malcolm, lived in Sydney and could I track him down. Coincidentally, I knew a Malcolm Davis through business, he being chairman of Mercantile Mutual Insurance, so I rang and asked if he was the person I was looking for. Yes he was and referred to a letter written to his father by his brother advising of the purchase of the car for Davis Gelatine and referring to it as the Wallie car. Malcolm knew the car as black, but could not identify which car it was from the description I was giving him, so I sent photos of them from Royal Daimlers by Brian Smith (pages237 and 239), which enabled him to advise it was the James Young one.

We're not finished yet. Between Leonie and Bill, the family was tracked down, in a Newcastle suburb and so the three of us and Leonie's husband arranged a visit to view the jewellery. Chris Westgarth's widow and her daughters made us welcome and showed off the treasures comprising six decanters in a wooden frame, two small trays with four silver tumblers in each, a silver (EPNS) flask sitting in a wooden collar, a silver box and a silver cocktail shaker.

The last word is that the Hooper bodied car is in Melbourne, owned by Ken Stuchbury, a member of the Victorian club.

MINUTES OF A MEETING OF THE COMMITTEE OF THE DAIMLER & LANCHESTER OWNERS CAR CLUB OF AUSTRALIA INC HELD AT RYDE EASTWOOD LEAGUES CLUB ON MONDAY 6TH JUNE 2016

Meeting commenced 7.10pm with Jim Gellett in the chair

Apologies. Nil

Refer previous General Meeting were no additional items of discussion were required by the Committee. Alan did note at least three designaated meetings would be desirable, or more if necessary, over on a annual basis. All members agreed

General business:

Introduced by way of a specific Agenda requiring Committee consideration. That is: "Club Registration of Vehicles & the associated responsibilities of the Club Executive, Club Office Bearers & Club Members"

Various representations were made by Graham & Peter in regards the RMS & legal implications respectfully. Alan also provided some insights, as did Merv, as our CMC rep. into their understandings Warren Cole, our Conditional Plates Registrar also attended the meeting, seeking clarifications as to his responsibilities & liabilities in exercising his role in the club & articulated his concerns.

It was determined by the the Committee that:

- 1. The registered operator of a vehicle must be a financially paid member of the DLOCCA before a conditional plate registration form will be signed by the Registrar
- 2. The Conditional Plates Registrar must know the car from personal experience. To know"Of" the car is not sufficient. The Registrar must have seen the car & is familiar with its roadworthiness before signing the Conditional Plate form. It is the members responsibility to ensure this occurs by either bringing the car to a club event or making other arrangements with the Registrar for the car to be viewed & assessed. The Registrars contact details are in the Club magazine.
- 3. The registrar must sight the car every year at least once or have first hand knowledge of the car before signing the RMS Historic Vehicle Declaration. This is at the Registrars own discretion.
- 4. For new Concessional Plate Registration the owner of the vehicle must provide the Registrar with evidence of ownership of the car & proof of identity eg drivers license
- 5. It remains the owners full responsibility, to opt into the 60day Log book Historical Plate system .The owner of the vehicle is soley responsible to maintain & abide with the RMS, Police Authorities & other relevant Authorities regulations at all times.

PART TEN - REPAIRING AND FITTING THE PASSENGER REAR DOOR

It was obvious that this door was rusted because the rust holes were clearly visible through the paint on the door skin.

Luckily apart from the rust in the bottom panel, the door was structurally sound. The bottom panel itself was easy to replace, as it is made from simple folds.

The bottom panel is attached to the door frame with pop rivets.

I fitted the door lock without any problems, and the window frame also required minimal adjustment to get it to work correctly. However, similar to the other rear door, the window lifting channel was rusted beyond repair.

I must admit that remaking this lifting channel was a lot easier than the first one. Once attached to the window, the window winding mechanism worked fine.

Getting the panel gaps right seems to take the same amount of time as it does to complete the rust repairs. On this occasion, I made a miscalculation in the width of the skin repair, and had to add more metal to the bottom of the door to get the gap right.


