

EXHAUST NOTES FROM THE DLOCCA SP250 REGISTER



We had a great turn out of 20 people at out Darter's meeting at the home of David and Dallas Stoodley on 14 June. A good number considering that several of our regulars were in UK for the SP250 60th Anniversary Rally. We were particularly pleased to welcome Tim & Tracey Mallyon and Roger & Scott Anson together with formed SP owners, Roger Giles and David Saunders. The traditional garage visit had a special focus as the Darters clustered around David's SP450 project. The Majestic Major motor looks particularly comfortable in the SP engine bay.

A major item discussed at the meeting was my decision to stand down from the position we may call Convenor of the SP250 Group. I explained that I thought that after just on 20 year in the role it was time for someone else to take the role and bring some new ideas and youthful vigour to the position. I explained that I had discussed my retirement with both Merv McDonald, who is SP250 Registrar for the Daimler Club and Mark Brooks who already maintains an active communications network of SP owners around Australia. After extended discussion it was decided that we would discuss the future of the SP250 Group and the role of Convenor (which could possibly be shared by several people) at the next meeting which will be at the home of Tony and Rosie Luongo on Friday 2 August. That discussion should reach a conclusion which will allow me to hand over at the following meeting at the home of Mark & Tracey Brooks on Friday 4 October.

The other major item for discussion was preparation for an SP250 60th Anniversary display at the All British Day at Kings School on Sunday 15 September. It seems we may be able to assemble around 20 SP250s including Tim Mallyon's restoration project. We will also have the V8 250 engine restored by Matt Walton's nephew together with a collection of photographs and diagrams. We will proceed with the plan for helium balloons but we make have left it too late to order special jackets.

I also reported on the Unique Cars - Rolling 30 event at Sydney Motor Sport Park where owners with cars over 30 years old were able to drive laps of the short course. The runs were in 10 to 15 minute slots with cars in categories such as Pre-70s and All British. Cars were limited to 100kph as drivers did not have to have a

helmet of race licence. My observation was that it would have been very difficult to get to 100kph on the tight twisting short course. Over 150 cars registered for the day long event and I recommend this event to Darters when it comes arounds again in 2020.

PARTS REQUIRED FOR A SPECIAL SPORTS PROJECT

The following is a list of unique to Daimler model parts I need to assist in the completion of my Special Sports. These parts were found to be missing either during move by previous owner or were lost/damaged during part restoration. I was hopeful that the previous owner could locate these items but as time passes I think not.

To assist, I have separately identified items that appear in the club's listed spares for a Special Sports and also for the Lanchester. If the club is willing to supply some/all of these items could a list of items willing to be provided and their total cost be forwarded thanks.

- Both Side panels to the bonnet. (2 pieces in total)
- The front valance of the car. (1 piece in total)
- Rear chrome bumper. I have brackets and over-riders. (1 piece in total)
- Heater/demister. (Complete unit)
- Inlet and outlet taps for heater demister plumbing at engine (2 pieces in total)
- Passenger's quarter window glass, mine cracked (1 piece in total)

Note: These spares reported in Special Sports collection.

- Both bonnet hinges. (2 pieces in total)
- Both boot lid hinges. (2 pieces in total) I have found 1 hinge badly rusted and seized.
- Two wheel studs and nuts. These are missing from my car. (4 pieces in total) May need to take whole wheel assembly to remove and spares also missing wheel studs.
- One short arm suspension damper. (1 piece in total) I have 3 log arm dampers and one short arm damper.
- Spark plug cover. Mine damaged but I have repaired it. (1 piece in total).
- Radio Amplifier. I have tuner. (TBA May forego this item or install later transistorised unit)

Note There are spares of these items in Lanchester Project.

- One interior door handle. (1 piece in total)
- The trafficator switch mechanism is missing. (Several small pieces)

The car was a 1927 Pontiac, owned by Max Goldsmith and the car completed the task of 10000 miles over 10 days with only regular servicing every 500 miles and refueling as required (about 20 mpg).

The talk was based on John's own recollections as well as recent mention of an article about the trial by the Late Rob Gunnell.

There being no further business the meeting concluded at 9.20 p.m.



1949 DAIMLER DB 18 CONSORT RESURRECTION

PART FORTY THREE - RE-ASSEMBLY Denis Leys

The re-assembly continues with the fitting of the brakes, but the first task was to find all the parts as they had been dissembled years ago. I managed to find everything needed but they were all coated in layers of dirt and rust which had to be removed with an angle grinder and wire wheel. After cleaning up the brake drums they were given a good coating of heat resistant paint.


Luckily for me, the previous owner had all the drums machined, and all the shoes re-lined. Fitting the rear brake shoes was difficult until I discovered that the springs had to be fitted to the shoes first, and then levered onto the adjusters with screw drivers. The front brakes on the other hand were easy to fit, although at this stage I have only greased the wheel bearings leaving their adjustment until I fit the front springs.

You will recall that I resprayed the black on the body because of defects in the final finish. This meant that I had to repeat the flatting and buffing processes. On this occasion I started the flatting process with 2000 grit followed by 3000 before starting the buffing process.

For the moment I have only completed the first step of the buffing process because I am starting to fit the doors and chromed window pieces. Fitting these pieces leaves fingerprints all over the paint finish. I will complete the buffing when all the chrome is in place.

THE LANCHESTER PROJECT

Friday 31 May - Present Merv McDonald, Bob Aylward and myself. Today work continued on the installation of the roof lining due to the unusual treatment wanted for around the rear window. Merv and Bob also spent time locating and cleaning the various interior A, B and C pillar lining items in preparation for their installation.

Friday 7 June - Present Jim Gellett, Merv McDonald, Colin Cox, John Hiscox, John Steel and myself. Roof lining work this week was restricted to gluing it to the front sun visor area. Merv plans to do the cut and polish of the body work next Friday, so the rest of the day was spent preparing the windscreen for installation and its installation.

We have two front and rear windscreens and both front windscreen glass needed cleaning. This saw both Colin Cox and John Steel on hands and knees scraping and polishing the glass. The rubber seal was then cut and mounted around the glass before the glass was installed in the car. This was done using the string method but with the glass inside the car and the string pulled from the outside. The many hands present made it an easy operation, supporting the glass from falling backwards into the car as the seal was pulled into place.

Friday 14 June - There were only 3 of us today, Merv, John Steel and myself (John Hiscox). While Merv wanted to buff up the paint work, it was decided to get the motor running again since connecting up the fuel line instead of the gravity tin direct to the pump, that had been in place. Lo and behold it wouldn't start. Priming the carby would get it going but only for that amount of fuel, so the conclusion was either a blockage in the line from the tank, or the reserve valve was the impediment. The car needs to be jacked up to enable access to the reserve valve and a compressor is needed In the meantime, the brake fluid reservoir and the rocker cover were looking very shabby in contrast to the rest of the engine, so they were taken off, stripped of their paint and repainted. Re-assembly will also be next week.

Thursday 13 June - Present Merv McDonald and myself a day early. Today Merv and I checked the fuel line from the fuel tank to the carby. We had purchased \$30 worth of fuel and first added it to the fuel tank, but still Merv couldn't prime the carburetor. So this suggested it wasn't a lack of fuel in the tank. The main/reserve tap is seized but is redundant due to the blocking off of one fuel connection at the fuel tank. Regardless we found vacuum at the tap and also at the one fuel line connected to the fuel tank and the disconnected fuel line at the tank was not causing a vacuum leak. Thus suggesting a blockage in the pipe into the fuel tank itself. Fortunately I had some wire and we cleared the blockage and re-connected the fuel line. Merv then succeeded to prime the carburetor. The car started almost immediately and we ran it to warm up. A possible part exposed insulated connector in the temporary wiring had at the start of the day insulation tape applied to prevent further possible short circuiting. This may have prevented the engine being switched off the previous week.

After lunch I re-tacked the front section of roof lining, but there are still two minor stretch lines I need to fix next week to get it right. We also gave the exterior a dust off and wash in preparation for Merv to commence cut and polish of the body work.


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

Friday 21 June - Present Merv McDonald, John Steel and myself (John Hiscox). The first job being to find out why the car wouldn't start. The good news was that Merv and Graham had gone to Russell's the day before and did the job. This was to disconnect the fuel line and rod out the plaque inside. So our jobs today were to re-install the the newly painted brake fluid container and the rocker cover. Life wasn't meant to be easy as the former item did not want to be reconnected. But perseverance prevailed. Then the air cleaner and oil bath gave a bit of trouble and will be completed next week. The tappets were given another check before putting the cover back on and various bits of window surround chrome were polished.

The fuel gauge sender unit had been removed the day before and it was realized the gasket needed replacing. A new gasket was made today and installed.
