


SPECIAL SPORTS RESTORATION - PARTS NEEDED

LANCHESTER INSPECTION DAY AT SPRINGWOOD

As Club Members will know, some time ago the Club was offered the opportunity to receive, free of purchase cost, a Lanchester Leda project from the owner who had done some work to the car but had decided, probably for many reasons, to not proceed further with it.

Malcolm Nixon had made the shipping a reality for us and that was a great and generous gift to the Club.

I must confess that when I first saw the car I thought that we had received a parts car with it, not realizing that the stripped down heap of metal in front of me was the car that we had "acquired".

Well, in the time since club members have started to work on the car until now it has been transformed. Not only has it been reassembled and made to run the process has involved careful restoration of mechanical parts, cleaning and refinishing (the engine bay looks very good indeed) and some considered work had gone into establishing the original colour of the car and that has been the colour chosen to now present it to the world.

Often we see cars that have been restored and painted in more modern colours. Sometimes it works and the new colour chosen highlights the car and makes it look very smart but sometimes the colour chosen detracts from the overall appeal of the car (no one mention a certain yellow Special Sports).

Original colours very often just look "right" on a car. A metallic finish when none was available at the time of manufacture can detract rather than enhance, similarly very bright modern duco finishes can be too much but the soft green that the Lanchester has been painted is really attractive for it, it enhances the rounded body shape (note my puffy jacket is a similar colour to cover my rounded body shape to best advantage too).

I remember the car in Canberra when it was painted a bottle green, which did not suit it as well as the soft green it now appears in, and the duco also helps tone down the lurid mustard coloured upholstery that was refinished at some time in the past, too good to discard but not an ideal colour.

The engine was started for those of us gathered to inspect the car and it sounds very sweet. The four-cylinder motor is very nicely balanced and smooth and should provide a very reliable heartbeat for the car. While it won't terrorise the traffic, it will keep up and a comfortable cruising speed of 55 mph should not be an effort on the open road.

I was amazed at the progress that had been made by the "works team", Merv McDonald, Graham McDonald, John Steel, John Hiscox, Jim Gellett, Linden Braye and Bob Aylward with help from Russell Turner and others as they can make the time to drop by to help.

While there is still a way to go with fitting up of door rubbers, finishing the headlining and interior and the wiring, the job done so far is brilliant, and once the car is finished, and the duco given the tick of approval from Merv the Perfectionist it will be a wonderful addition to Club Runs and Events and a testament to the hard work and dedication of the "works team" in bringing back to life a fine old car from a marque that would otherwise not be seen much at all in today's world of fierce traffic and road rage.

KEN DOUBLE - ORGAN RECITAL



A former radio and television sportscaster who started taking organ lessons as an 8-year-old in Chicago, KEN DOUBLE has enjoyed a second career focused on his love of the music of the theatre pipe organ. He is preparing for his 7th tour of Australia and New Zealand set for August of 2019.

As a sportscaster, Ken broadcast NBA and major college basketball, NHL and AHL hockey, the worldwide broadcast of the Indy 500, and more. But since retiring in 2008, Ken has toured performing concerts on the great theatre pipe organs around the world.

He also helped establish the Long Center Theatre Organ Society in Lafayette, Indiana; spent ten years as the President of the American Theatre Organ Society; and currently is the Director of Fundraising for the Historic Organ Restoration Committee, the organization restoring the largest musical instrument in the world, the Midmer-Losh organ at Boardwalk Hall in Atlantic City, NJ.

Ken Double performed his first concert in 1978; has 20 recordings to his credit; will perform his 37th annual concert at Long Center in June of 2019; and is one of the organists at the famed Atlanta Fox theatre playing "Mighty Mo," the great Moller theatre organ heard there since 1929. His theatre organ credits also include performing the role of Master of Ceremonies for more than 20 ATOS annual and regional conventions.

Known for bringing wit and humor along with his lyrical arrangements, Ken is thrilled to be coming "Down Under" for another tour through this theatre organ-loving part of the world.

Do come along to this Concert as it will be very entertaining.



1949 DAIMLER DB 18 CONSORT RESURRECTION

PART FORTY FOUR - REMOVING AND REPLACING REAR SIDE WINDOW AND QUARTER VENT GLASS

The Consort has two rear fixed side windows with chrome surrounds which in my case needed re-chroming. Removing the glass from the chrome surrounds is easy enough starting with the eight grub screws which hold the end piece in place. The hardest part is freeing up the glass from the old rubber seal.

I used a "Gem" razor blade to break the seal by gently tapping the blade between the rubber and the glass. As soon as the seal was loosened, a hardwood block and mallet were then used to gently tap the edge of the brass frame away from the glass. It is a slow process, but I managed to remove the glass from both frames without any breakages to either the frame or glass.


After having both frames rechromed I purchased a roll of un-vulcanised rubber to re-seal the windows. After a bit of trial and error I found that it was easier to tape the rubber to the glass first, and then insert the glass into the frame. Once the end frame is recrewed back in place, the excess rubber can be trimmed with the "Gem" blade.

The same process was used to remove and replace the rubber seal in the front quarter vents. The new rubber seals can be hardened by placing the windows in the sun.

THE LANCHESTER PROJECT

Friday 28 June - Present Jim Gellett, Merv McDonald, John Steel and myself. Today was very trying for everyone.

I decided to install the replacement rubber grommet for the gear change pedal through the firewall. The new rubber grommet was not a good fit but fortunately Jim eventually found the original grommet and I installed it. In the mean time I tried to re-install the air intake to heater box. If it wasn't difficult enough working upside down under the dash the unit has two bolts and four screws. The four screws go into captive threads on a metal plate concealed inside the intake that is not attached to the body and this plate would move out of position each time you tried to insert a screw. On the plus side I did install the wiper motor to its fire wall mounting bracket without too much difficulty.

Merv started buffing the bodywork, but hadn't realized he had brought an old buffing machine which slowed him down and he will need to do more buffing next week.

As I mentioned Jim found the Gear Change Pedal grommet whilst he unsuccessfully searched through the Lanchester parts for the two windscreen washer jets that were not original equipment but there are holes in the cowl for them. Jim also helped John Steel and both struggled getting the air filter back on after it being painted as you need to be a contortionist to get some of the bolts located. John did succeed eventually and probably handled the frustration the best of us.

Thursday 4 July - Present Merv McDonald and myself. Today Merv and I attended. Merv decided that the rear quarter windows should be in place for the approaching Lanchester day. This proved to be quite difficult with the roof lining in place and the angle required for the bolts to be inserted. The car being in its covered area made seeing from every angle quite difficult but we were successful eventually. I mean time did some work on the front roof lining installed the rear parcel shelf and also the back of the rear seat to give members an idea of the finished product.

Friday 5 July - Present Merv McDonald, John Hiscox, John Steel. The day was spent buffing the car and installing the chrome strips at the top of the painted section of the four doors. The engine was also run.

Friday 12 July - Present Jim Gellett, Merv McDonald, John Hiscox, John Steel. The interior of the car was given a tidy up for the display day and several items in the engine bay attended to.

Friday 26 July - Present Jim Gellett, Merv McDonald, John Hiscox, John Steel, Colin Cox and myself. Today Jim and John Steel tried to bleed the brakes but without success as there is a blockage/air lock some where, which will require further investigation. I had located missing roof lining material and glued this to the roof at the front of the car. I also installed rubber hose missing from the drain to the heater box.


John Hiscox cleaned and polished the exterior door handles and cut out new rubber grommets. The handles were then installed on the car giving the car a hint of nearing completion.
