

KEITH ASHWORTH MEMORIAL

The Man Who Couldn't Help But Inspire Others - A DAIMLER LOVE STORY

It is almost one year since the passing of my beloved Keith, and time to reflect and share with you some thoughts of my own.

Firstly, I wish to thank the Daimler community and membership, local and international for their support, comfort and friendship.

Albeit slightly tongue-in-cheek, I thank the UK club and Peter Towns for publication of the tribute to Keith earlier this year, "The Man Who Couldn't Help Himself" which brought a good measure of mirth to an otherwise shocked readership on learning of his untimely death.

It ultimately served to illustrate the length and breadth of a love affair of the man with a Daimler obsession, a commitment and dedication to a marque. Despite this, it is also important to know, the same vigour manifested itself in his loyalty and support of his family and friends. It is this same ardour that marked his redoubtable and peerless devotion to his wife and therein lies the centrepiece of a unique Daimler love story.

We met via mother's beautiful Barker body Special Sports and it was his Dart that made its way to my heart, winning his fair lady's hand.

Invariably interlaced with references to his Daimler, Keith wooed me with his poems;

"In the red Dart speeding through the hills

Together we'll have all the thrills.

Exploring and enjoying nature's delights

Together we'll see such marvellous sights.

You and me in my favourite toy

Together the future will bring plenty of joy

Without you my life so incomplete

Come driving with me in one of the fleet!"

... how could I resist the invitation.

Needless to say he progressed to a marriage proposal in the Dart, announced our engagement at Daimler rally 'murder mystery' night, ensured a Daimler was front and centre stage at our wedding, organised our honeymoon around the Daimler Centenary events in Scotland and Coventry then continued to introduce me to the Daimler family far and wide.

In fact, this particular verse underpinned our time together. He was my vehicle to a life of adventure and the adventure of life, mostly the centre of which was driven by his Daimlers. He truly was a driving force whether in a Daimler or not, in every sense of the word, chauffeuring me in my world and me into his.

On our travels his agenda was all too obvious, he was loving and wise enough to always package a trip to include my interests and loved being involved! Through his 'business' trips we have met and maintained some enduring national and international Daimler friends.

An inveterate traveller, he was particularly skilled in mapping various trips between Daimler events to experience the uniqueness of Australia's wide plains and regional townships, applying the same principles on our trips abroad.

Daimlers were an enduring, addictive passion that founded an unwavering routine of one day per week on his projects, a labour of love, preserving Daimler history, moreover, putting the car back on the road. While often one could argue the economic viability, he was careful in approaching daunting projects with vision and a calculating, cautious optimism to achieve the unachievable. His pursuit of this vision was underpinned by employing a cunning frugality borne out of his career as a credit controller. It was a rare, fine balance of compromise, authenticity and optimum functionality. Rarely did he plan to part with his Daimler recreations. I am certain that these fundamentals underlined his quest in bargain hunting, which for him, was a sport, a thrilling chase, whether it be the common grocery or related to his projects. His passionate driving addiction in his restorations was equally infectious and to this end, he imbued and inspired others with a confidence and belief in their own projects, which is a mark of a true clubman. Do not be fooled, Keith was multidimensional, an expert cross-worder, quiz king, quick-wit, comic relief, proficient speed reader, poet, ardent current affairs follower, weather man extraordinaire, stamp-collector from childhood, equally knowledgeable on trains, planes, automobiles and sea-craft, lover of music, vigneron, food buff and a consummate social-'tiger-moth' to name a few!!!

It was a truly unique and fitting fanfare for his final trip, to be escorted to his resting place by seven cars from his own stable of Daimlers serving as the family coaches in the cortege, along with other clubmen and their Daimlers. A veritable Daimler event in itself. The funeral directors requested permission to video this unique cortege for their website.

In conclusion, this enigma of a man that couldn't help but sweep people up in his Daimler orb was a man of contradictions and it can be said he embodied the very car with which he is synonymous and indeed, epitomized the SP250 'Dart'.....

I am sure you will all agree, a car of equal contradictions.

In essence, I leave you with my tribute:

"A man generous to a fault but a credit controller by default

Simple to taste yet dealt complexity in haste

Could be both lateral to think but deep to a brink."

I continue to read and follow with fervour the Daimler news locally and abroad...

I cannot help myself!

HISTORIC AND CLASSIC VEHICLE LOG BOOK

The following communication was received from RMS relating to the use of Log Books:

Transport for NSW recently conducted a review of the Log Book Trial, operating under the Historic and Classic Vehicle Schemes. As part of the Trial, Transport for NSW received feedback from a broad range of stakeholders to evaluate the effectiveness of the program.

From 1 October 2019, the Log Book will become a permanent feature of the Historic and Classic Vehicle Schemes. Transport for NSW will deliver a number of improvements to the schemes over the next 12 months based on the feedback received during the review.

Existing requirements introduced during the Trial will continue to apply to participants, including:

- Vehicles registered under the Historic and Classic Vehicle Schemes can be operated for 60 days of general road use each year, outside of club organised events.
- Each day of general use must be recorded in a Log Book issued at Service NSW branches.
- Owners wishing to opt into the Log Book program should be a member of a Transport for NSW recognised Classic or Historic Vehicle Club, or Approved Organisation participating in the Log Book program.

Information and updates to the Log Book program and proposed improvements will be communicated to Historic and Classic Vehicle Clubs and Approved Organisations in writing in the coming weeks.

Please ensure Transport for NSW has up-to-date club contact details, including a valid email address, so we can inform you of upcoming changes to the Log Book.

1949 DAIMLER DB 18 CONSORT RESURRECTION

PART FORTY EIGHT - REASSEMBLY


Fitting the windscreen on the Consort is a two-step process; fitting the glass to the chrome frame, and then fitting the frame to the vehicle (the frame is attached to the body with a series of screws inside the car). Fitting the frame requires two people – one pushing from the outside, and the other attaching the screws on the inside, and don't forget to fit the rubber seals on the wiper shafts before attaching the frame.

I have also started fitting up the doors with their locks and windows. I sourced generic window seals locally and found them easy to fit, however it is a good idea to use a little contact glue at the top of the window channel to stop the felts moving when the windows are raised and lowered. I also took the opportunity to apply adhesive sound deadening material to the inside of the doors.

The front springs were fitted using a trolley jack under the main suspension arm to compress the spring. I put a suitably large bolt through the hole in the arm to stop the jack from slipping as the spring was compressed until the spherical bearing bolt could be positioned. Fitting any spring is a dangerous process, and the Consort spring is no different; it tends to go off centre as it compresses, and I had to use a pry bar and ratchet strap to keep the alignment. You need to be very careful until all suspension bolts are in place. A compressed spring contains an enormous amount energy and you don't want it to let go.

THE LANCHESTER PROJECT

Thursday 31 October 2019 - Present myself. Took advantage of another day by myself to work on the wiring for the car. Everything seemed to go well in the morning and I thought I had done enough to test the circuitry after lunch. Well after lunch I connected the battery only to find the oil and ignition dash warning lights were both on ignition off. After much tracing of circuits I found that I had connected the wires to the ignition switch one position to the left of where they should have been. The difficulty then became removing the wires from each connector from behind the dash and moving them across. This was further exacerbated when I misplaced the only small screw driver I had with me. So stoked with the knowledge of what needed to be done I decided to leave the wiring till Friday.

Friday 1 November 2019 - Present Jim Gellett, Merv McDonald, John Hiscox, John Steel and myself. On arrival it is usual for us to first have morning tea. I instead got stuck into the wiring and had the warning light problem sorted.

Jim worked on finishing the "B" pillar repairs and with John Hiscox assistance, also cleaning and painting the timber look door caps. Merv and John Steel worked on the brakes that took some effort to get bled through at first. It was then found that the ball bearing that sits behind the bleed nipple on the repaired wheel cylinder had been replaced and there weren't any spares at Russell's. This means it will take another visit to hopefully get the front brakes working.

I too encountered more gremlins with my wiring. Despite the wiring being connected correctly I was unable to get the dash illumination lights to work. This is a bit of a mystery as the side lights that work off the same connection work but there is no power to the dash circuit. I still have a few other wires to connect but I am getting close to the end. It is very uncomfortable lying on the floor of this car due to the seat runner mounts being permanent fixtures to the floor.

Friday 22 November 2019 - Present Jim Gellett, Merv McDonald and John Steel. Merv & John continued to work on the brakes but to no avail. Merv has diagnosed that the seals in the wheel cylinders are oversize & do not allow the pistons to move within the cylinder under pressure.

He will acquire more seals. Jim attended to the imperfections in the bodywork on the front O/S gard & replaced BOTH headlamp globes. Merv also reported that he had seen Bob Aylward & that he was slowly improving in health. Otherwise a good day was had by all.


