

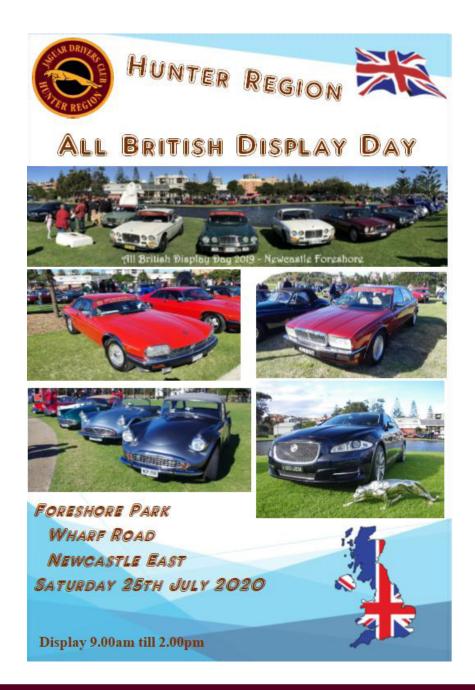

HISTORIC AND CLASSIC VEHICLE LOG BOOK

The following communication was received from RMS relating to the use of Log Books:

Transport for NSW recently conducted a review of the Log Book Trial, operating under the Historic and Classic Vehicle Schemes. As part of the Trial, Transport for NSW received feedback from a broad range of stakeholders to evaluate the effectiveness of the program.

From 1 October 2019, the Log Book will become a permanent feature of the Historic and Classic Vehicle Schemes. Transport for NSW will deliver a number of improvements to the schemes over the next 12 months based on the feedback received during the review.

Existing requirements introduced during the Trial will continue to apply to participants, including:

- Vehicles registered under the Historic and Classic Vehicle Schemes can be operated for 60 days of general road use each year, outside of club organised events.
- Each day of general use must be recorded in a Log Book issued at Service NSW branches.
- Owners wishing to opt into the Log Book program should be a member of a Transport for NSW recognised Classic or Historic Vehicle Club, or Approved Organisation participating in the Log Book program.

Information and updates to the Log Book program and proposed improvements will be communicated to Historic and Classic Vehicle Clubs and Approved Organisations in writing in the coming weeks.

Please ensure Transport for NSW has up-to-date club contact details, including a valid email address, so we can inform you of upcoming changes to the Log Book.


It was noted that the next meeting will be the Clubs Annual General Meeting and members were encouraged to attend .

1949 DAIMLER DB 18 CONSORT RESURRECTION

PART FIFTY - ENGINE REASSEMBLY CONTINUED

I stripped down my most serviceable rocker assembly and discovered that all the rocker faces had minor recessing caused by the valve stems. When I restored my tractor, I had a similar problem and tried to get the rockers refaced by a local engine re-conditioner only to be told that this service was no longer available. Rather than use damaged rockers, I made up my own jig and refaced the rockers with a few light passes against a fine grinding wheel. I finished up the rocker faces with an oil stone.

Reassembling the rocker assembly is easy enough if you keep careful notes of what goes where when you pull it apart in the first place. I made certain that all the oilways were clear before putting everything back together and ensured that the oil feed hole in the rocker shaft was correctly aligned with the feed hole in the rear rocker mount.

I made a new gasket for the rocker cover which I have loosely fitted for the time being because I intend to re torque the head once the engine has been run. I had an auto electrician friend check out the starter motor before refitting it.

I decided to alter the oil filter housing to fit a paper element using the instructions provided by Steve Moore, which can be found on the DB18 website. These alterations involve reducing the diameter of the metal filter support and improving the oil flow in the housing by removing some metal. Unfortunately, the oil seal which comes with the replacement filter is the wrong size, but I was able to find a suitable replacement on eBay.

Reassembling the housing is straight forward and I am hoping that the new seal is up to the task of keeping the oil inside.



THE LANCHESTER PROJECT

Friday 29 November 2019 - Present Jim Gellett, Merv McDonald, John Steel, Linden Braye and myself. Merv had come up between visits and replaced the seals in the wheel cylinders for the correct size. That meant that all that was needed was to have someone press the pedal as the wheels were turned. At last we have front brakes working. Great effort Merv and John.

Jim put some work in repairing some minor blemishes to the paint work on the driver's front guard but he ran out of paint to finish the work.

With the brakes finally sorted, work for the others moved to the installation of the interior door trims whilst I worked on the wiring. I installed the high beam and trafficator dash warning lights donated by Ian Brenner. Jim was quite keen for the drivers side semaphor to be re-installed and this was done next. I also connected the ground wire for the wipers and tested OK. Finally I managed to track down the problem with the dash illumination lights to a poor connection from the switch.

December/January Break taken due to holidays and the extremely hot weather conditions.

Friday 24 January - Present Jim Gellett and myself. Today we took a load of paver bricks up to Springwood, approximately 14' x 7' area, for the floor of Lanchester House. About 1/2 as many again are still to be moved up to Springwood at a later date. It has been a problem jacking the car up and also working under the car with just road base for a floor.

Friday 14 February - Present Jim Gellett, Merv McDonald, Bob Alward and myself. This was our first real work day back for 2020. It had been raining for over 1 week at Springwood and although it was fine today, it was quite disappointing to see those tools and spares kept in Lanchester House soaking wet. Jim and Bob got to work on trim for the Lanchester whilst Merv and I laid everything out on tarps to dry out. 
Friday 21 February - Present Jim Gellett, Merv McDonald, John Hiscox.
