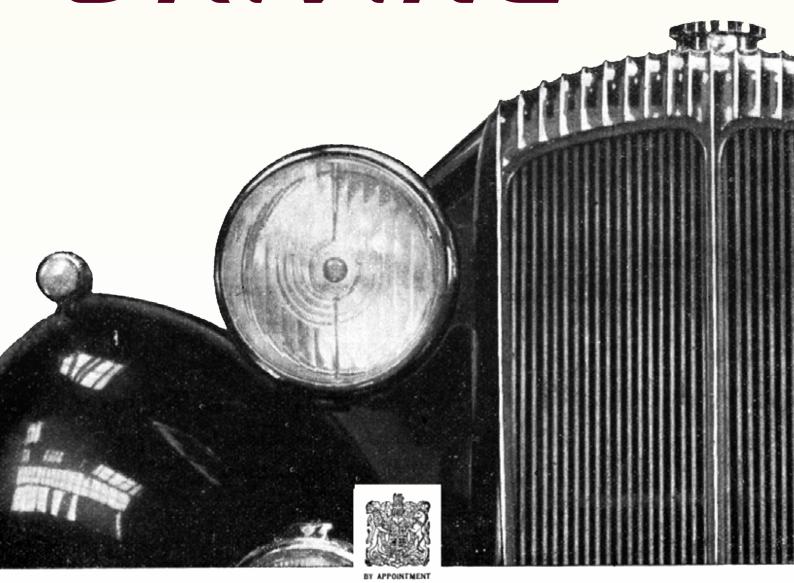

Hope you are all well. Who would have thought six months ago that the Lanchester project would still be incomplete. This virus has really messed everything up for people and now it looks possible that this second wave may have us shut down again. The Sprite Club had started up running events last month but has closed them down again because of the new restaurant restrictions and the second wave of infections in NSW.

On a more positive note, I was asked to go to the motor trimmers yesterday to discuss the design of the interior lining for the Special Sports, as both the hood and interior linings had finally arrived. We went through all the photos I had taken and the actual layout of the car. The 1980's restoration magazine article was also useful as it had a photo of just the hood lining attached to the bows. They had some nice cars there too, an early E-Type a modern Maserati Convertible and what caught my eye was a late 1960's early 1970's Alfa Romeo GT. The Science Master at my school had one of these, so it brought back memories.

As the Special Sports didn't have an original hood for them to copy, I have been told it should take a couple of weeks to get the lining made to their satisfaction then they will ask me back to discuss the fitting of any padding before making the actual hood itself. CMC USE - UPDATE AS AT 2ND APRIL 2020

Important Message From the CMC Use of Vehicles under Conditional Registration For Essential Purpose - Update as at 2nd April 2020

It has come to our attention that the NSW Police have pulled over a number of vehicles on conditional registration (H, J, D, E and S plates) and questioned whether their use is for essential purposes.

Vice President Boyd Symington finally got through to Transport for NSW (RMS) Policy Branch with a great deal of persistence.

This is a summery of their response:

As long as club members follow NSW State restrictions, such as only going direct to the mechanic, the shops, medical practitioners, pharmacies or to work they are allowed to use HVS and CVS vehicles with the filled out log book. That does not include trips to try the car out or charge the battery etc. as far as we interpret it. Those reasons could be considered spurious by any authority who pulls you up.

There obviously can be no club events where people gather. We suggest that no club sanction or organise any such activity as fines are substantial.

Note that two unrelated people in the front seat of a vehicle are breaking the distancing rules. If they are not family or live with you then they are unrelated.

So go it alone is the safe way if you must go out in ANY vehicle.

If your club is not on the log book scheme then you cannot use the vehicle as club events are forbidden under the rules.

If you are taking such a vehicle to a mechanic it is suggested it be for essential work and you have a prior appointment with the mechanic.

Conditional number plates are a dead giveaway with all these scanning cameras in EVERY Police car nowadays.

It is suggested that members who do NEED to use a vehicle under conditional registration have a good reason ready.

1949 DAIMLER DB 18 CONSORT RESURRECTION

PART FIFTY FIVE - REASSEMBLING THE BODY PART 7

Although I have already fitted the main wiring loom, the secondary loom which carries the wiring to the rear of the vehicle had to be made and fitted. This loom carries the wiring for the taillights, brake lights, indicators, semaphores, and interior light. This connects to the main wiring loom at the end of the steering column. From this point the loom runs inside the chassis to the rear of the vehicle to two junction boxes located inside the chassis rail. However, my loom which runs inside the chassis to a point where it emerges under the rear seat and is then fed through into the boot and attached to two modern junction boxes. Positioning the junction boxes inside the boot area gives easier access and keeps the electrical contacts dry.


The rear light fittings are attached to the spare tyre door and include the brake, tail, and reverse lights which all contain LED lights. The housings for these lights have been re-chromed and the glass lenses have been given a coat taillight paint. The spare tyre door has now been fitted and the lights connected to the loom via the junction boxes.

With the tyre door now in place I was able to attach a new floorboard for the boot area, including the filler pieces on each side at the rear of the wheel wells. These pieces prevent items in the boot falling into the spare tyre area. As the support of boot floor itself relies on the metal filler piece attached to the boot door hinge bar, the boot lid was also fitted. Unfortunately, the first attempt at fitting the boot lid was unsuccessful because the edge of the lid below the hinge point was rubbing against the metal boot floor supports. This problem was rectified with some careful shimming.

Apart from the initial fitting problem, the boot alignment is perfect. The boot lock is yet to be fitted and I need to source some generic rubber seals for both the boot lid and tyre door. The turn indicator lights will be mounted on the bumper bar.



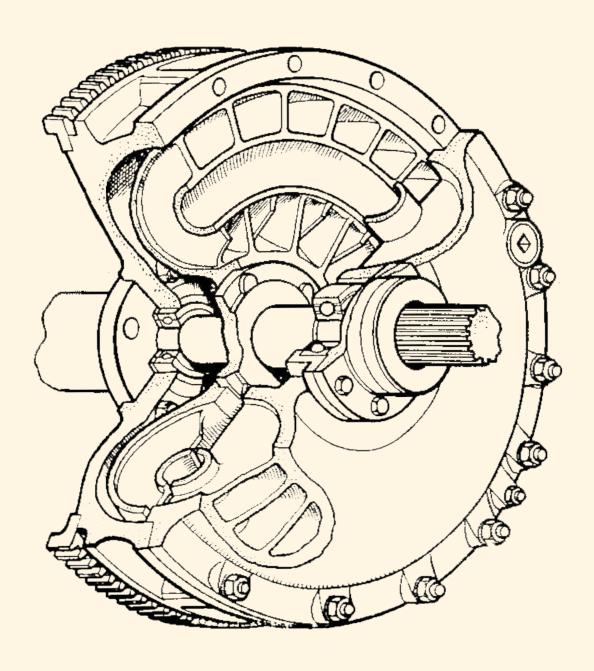
