

Despite all these advantages, and my tendency to scoff I only wish that now and then, I could turn the bugger off


HUNTER REGION ALL BRITISH DAY

THE LANCHESTER REPORT (NOT THIS MONTH)

In the absence of a Lanchester Report this month, the Editor sees fit to promote the four volumes written by Chris Clarke which chronicle the history of the Lanchester.

Volume 1

Developed from the author's unique archive of documents and photographs, many of them previously unpublished, Volume 1 of The Lanchester Legacy trilogy describes not only the Lanchester social and family history but also Lanchester's important inventions, including the disc brake, turbo-charging, power steering and so much more.







Body Reassembly Part 12

Assembly of the front - end panels continue, this time on the passenger side. Apart from the continuing problem of aligning bolts through multiple panels, positioning the two bolts holding the mudguard to its main support is a nightmare. Locating the bolts through the support and the guard is bad enough but locating the washers and nuts on the end of the bolts with the tips of your fingers is worse.

It took me some time, but I finally got all the panel bolts on both sides of the vehicle fully tightened. The chrome grill was next. Positioning the grill requires adjusting the height of the top of the radiator support first – there are two bolts on either side. When the height is correct, the top of the grill can be fixed into position with two set screws, followed by the bolts on each side, and finally the bolts through the front apron into its base.

I locked up all the apron bolts last after fitting the plastic mudguard piping between the guards and the apron, but not under the grill. With all the major panels now in place I am now able to fit the front bumper bar and all light fittings. However before doing this, I will need to do the final buffing of the paint on the apron and the front of the guards as the lights and bumper restrict access to these panels.


















TOOLS FOR SALE


