

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

I have audited the financial statements presented to me for the year ended 31st December, 2022, which showed a profit of \$2102 and Equity of \$37862.

1949 DAIMLER DB CONSORT RESURRECTION

PART 79 - INTERIOR TRIM PART 5

I have been making a new door card for the passenger rear door with the only salvageable parts from the old card being the metal retaining clips and the elastic from the door pocket. As I mentioned in my last article the door sizes are slightly different, so everything had to be remeasured. Making this door card was easier but still took a long time to finish.

I mentioned in this month's video, that it is important to spend the time in fitting the wood base to the door frame before bothering to cover it with vinyl. This includes attaching it to the door frame with the fitting screws. You should also mark where the screw holes are in the timber as they will be covered in vinyl and difficult to find. From past experience, I know that trying to drill though the vinyl with its wadding underlay will result in a mess.

The pillars between the doors are also have vinyl covers, with cloth covered rubber piping added to each side to provide a weather seal on the bottom part of the doors. The original covers for the vehicle were only good for making templates as the timber bases were rotted. However, I decided to re-use the rubber piping on the new covers. That was a mistake.

When I added the piping to the cover, I found that I couldn't close the door. I discovered that when I used thicker timber for the door cards, the card itself provided a tight seal against the pillar cover.

Having fitted one of the covers I also discovered that my vehicle was missing the piece of cloth covered trim that fits under the cover and provides support for the window frame rubber. Yet another piece of the jigsaw to make.







WANT TO BUY AN UNOBTRUSIVE LITTLE DAIMLER?

After 22 years, the time has come, I feel, to find another custodian for my 2.5 L Empress, aka "Her Imperial Greenness". It became clear driving to and from the Wagga Wagga rally in April that the steering and braking had become much heavier. Actually they hadn't, but it was four years since it had been on anything but short local runs, and I was four years older and now in my ninth decade.

Bought in September 2000 from an enthusiast in Sydney, this car is a Hooper-bodied saloon on the same chassis as the Barker Special Sports – DB18, but with twin SU carburettors, overdrive Wilson gearbox and worm-drive diff. 96 of them were made, from 1949 to 1952. This one left Hoopers in April 1951, and has been in light, private use ever since. Except for brief rest periods (being painted, rewired and the like) it has never been off the road. It was imported to Australia in 1997 by the previous owner. Its complete history is known, courtesy of UK DLOC historian Brian Smith. Since about 1980, in the hands of its last three owners, it has been a prime example of the infamous "rolling restoration". Records are available of work done over this time.

Apart from a bare-metal respray in the original two greens in 2005, plus a recent paint touch-up, virtually all the other work has been mechanical or electrical. Apart from regular servicing, brakes, steering, suspension, carburettors, gear linkages, cylinder head, distributor, wiring etc etc etc have all been repaired/overhauled as required.

With the exception of installation of an electric fuel pump, as far as possible the only departures from originality have been to make the car safer or easier to drive in modern traffic (headlight upgrades, flashing turning indicators, wiper upgrades, wing mirrors, LED stop/tail globes etc)

In 1996 the car was fitted with a fully-reconditioned, ex-UK-military DB18 motor, which (while not strictly original) is a huge asset; the over/under sizes used are on a brass plate on the block. While a tad cumbersome in urban traffic, it is a fine highway car, and returned 24 mpg on the run to/from Wagga Wagga. The interior is virtually original (including the rear-seat sheepskin mats), and its verifiable mileage is 77737. There will be a party in 40 miles. Original-specification cross-ply tyres are fitted. The car has been to every Australian National Rally since 2000, as well as the UK Centenary Rally in 1996, all without a hiccup. There is lots more to tell.

I have no idea what a fair price might be, but I am certainly not looking to make a killing – far from it. I am at least as interested in seeing it go to a home where it will continue to be used, appreciated and cared for. I would appreciate contact from interested folk who might discuss severance terms (ptowns@iinet.net.au).

The car has been on full road-registration (Victoria EMP999) for the last 20 years. While it would fail a RWC at present (see if you can guess why!) it should be straightforward to get to a roadworthy or club-reg-worthy state.

Buckley's deals on wheels

A dealer in Australia recently had a matching pair of Daimler Majestic Major limos for sale. I assume the quoted \$150,000 (about £85,000) gets you both. Oddly, it's perhaps the one car where, for me, the limousine looks better than the standard saloon.

When I started driving in the mid-'80s the odd Majestic Major saloon appeared in Autotroder. A nice one was £1000, but £400 was more likely for one of the mainly horrible examples.

My friend Adam went through a phase of buying them. Little more than a schoolboy, he cut a strange figure driving around in this huge, patrician car. His worst was a wedding car with brushpainted white rear seats - not what you want on that special day, but this was Manchester. It's odd to think such a datedlooking car was only about 20 years old at the time.

I devoured road tests on the Majestic Major, fascinated by acceleration that could leave almost any four-door standing in its day; a comparison in C&SC with a 420G, published circa 1985, captured my imagination such that it was a 'major' factor in my becoming a writer in the rarefied world of old knackers. Today I'd take the Jag any time, probably because I now look exactly like the sort of old fart that should be driving a Majestic Major, which wouldn't do at all.

I spent Christmas in Rome, which was great (apart from getting ripped off in a café: €80 for four beers and a place to spot old cars unless you like Fiat 500s. I suspect they have some sort of

special dispensation from the eco-fascists that allows them to run around the centre of the city at will, whereas everything else has to be electric or very new.

Over the past couple of years my friend Matthew Rees has been restoring a pair of Touring-bodied Lancia Flaminias, flipflopping between despair and joy as he unpicks decades of bodges and cock-ups in cars that take a while to understand. I especially loved his story about driving his silver GT back to the workshop through the outskirts of Swansea.

All was going well until the 3C 2.5-litre engine started playing up. It backfired so loudly that a builder threw his mobile phone out of his van in fright, midconversation, and a lady at a bus stop lobbed her fish and chips in the air involuntarily. Hastily exiting stage left, Matthew nursed the car home, applying the handbrake at the locked gate. to his yard but unwilling to leave the car in gear because he didn't want to risk switching the engine off. As he went to open the gate, he was suddenly aware that the Lancia was quietly disappearing back down the lane by force of gravity. Old-type Lancias, with their big wheel bearings, don't need much excuse to roll away.

A neighbour sat bemused in her Nissan as the Italian coupé headed in her direction with increasing speed while this normally sober pillar of the community tried to throw himself through the driver's window. He managed it, and even brought the Lancia to a halt – to the relief of all concerned.

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
DB18/CONSORT PARTS FOR SALE
