



October Report.

Our run on Sunday 27th was unfortunately only attended by a small number of SP'ers, despite the beautiful weather. Mark Brooks, Tim & Liam Mallyon, Bernard & Sari Macherel and Lenny Koles.

A big thankyou to Lenny for organising this run, for Tim who provided the summary attached and to Mark for the photos.

Well done guys.

While only a small group attended the SP250 run to Lancer Barracks in Parramatta, this enabled us to have a 'behind the scenes' tour of the workshop facility. Here Len showed us a Daimler Dingo Scout car which is currently being worked on. This vehicle is powered by a Daimler 2.5l 6 cyl engine which I understand is the same engine that powered the Daimler DB18. Len also showed us a tank which had just had some transmission work done. This would not have been an easy job as the gearbox weighs in at over 2 tonnes! The engineering and maintenance on these vehicles is in another league and makes working on a classic Daimler seem simple by comparison.

An Austin Champ and a LandRover with an enormous anti-tank gun were on show being driven around the complex, and people could opt to take a ride if they chose. Other vehicles on display included a Staghound armoured car, Daimler Ferret, Unimog a Matilda tank and a Centurion Tank. All the vehicles on display are all beautifully maintained, and are a credit to the team that look after them. It wasn't all tanks and armoured cars though, we also visited the museum, which houses all sorts of Australia war memorabilia dating back to the 1800's. You could spend hours in there, there's so much to see. If you haven't been to Lancer Barracks you should try and find the time to do so. It's open most Sundays from 10:00am and is well worth a visit.

ROYAL TOUR DAIMLER HEADING TO A NEW HOME


Auckland's Vice President Laurie McKernan, found this article about a 1953 Royal Tour Daimler that is driving to a new home in Oamaru.

In 1953 the New Zealand Government ordered six new Daimler Limousines that were to be used for Royal duties in the forthcoming Royal Tour of New Zealand. These were a special order with a total of only 18 such cars being built by Daimler, with their coachwork being completed by Hoopers of London. The other cars were also destined for the British Commonwealth, six going to Australia and the other six to South Africa.

As these cars were destined for royalty they were built to the highest standard and at the time were the largest and most expensive car in the world. Features include solid walnut trim, ten electric motors that power the sunroof, windows and the partition, a pull-out footplate for standing on to place the New Zealand flag in the holder on the roof, a speaker phone to communicate with the chauffeur, and roller-blinds on the windows.

All of the six New Zealand cars were sold during the 1950's , this one initially being used by a Christchurch firm. When its crankshaft broke it was sold and then put into storage by its new owner, a Timaru engineer. There it sat for many years deteriorating, and had vines growing up through it when Michael Minehan and his mother, Rita first saw it. The car was very shabby but still had an air of magnificence about it.

Michael bought the car in 1973 and then embarked on a

30-year restoration project. Over that time the car has been re-upholstered, repainted and reconditioned. Michael has become a little obsessed with the car and will only trust himself and his mechanic to drive it. The car only does a couple of trips per year and is a challenge to drive, requiring considerable concentration and some strength, having no power steering. Michael has used the Daimler to pick friends up from the airport, usually sporting the appropriate chauffeur-style peaked cap.

This gives him the advantage of being able to park in the VIP area just outside the international terminal.

ROYAL TOUR DAIMLER HEADING TO A NEW HOME

No parking warden would be game to face the consequences of having a royal or ministerial car towed away.

The Daimler has resided in the garage of Michael's mum, Rita Minehan's home for the past 30 years, but has to find a new home now that this house has been sold Michael had thought about shipping it to his home in Sydney, but decided it should stay in New Zealand as this is a New Zealand car, with its history and provenance here. The Royal Daimler is now destined to be a resident of the Oamaru Car Museum, with Michael retaining ownership and visiting and driving rights to the car. Kevin, the car's mechanic, will be charged with the task of driving the Daimler from Timaru to its new home in Oamaru. This won't be an inexpensive trip, it is estimated that the big limousine will consume something like \$100 in petrol alone.

Please note that no committee member would ever email you randomly with such a request. Always check the sender's email address and even if close to what you think is the correct email address of the alleged sender double check because it is going to be a scam.

1939 DB18/1 DAIMLER RITZ FOR SALE

Daimler first produced a medium sized chassis in 1934, and called it the Fifteen. That evolved to the DB17 1 and 2 and then the DB18/1 by 1938/39.

In 1939 a wealthy Sydney Doctor ordered a DB 18/1 and because she did not like black cars, chose an iridescent silver blue Ritz version of the DB 18/1.

The Ritz was a luxury edition of the standard DB 18/1 saloon, and appeared in both six light and four light sports saloon guise. This car, a four light features the Ritz options as follows:

- · Heavily plated engine components.
- Iridescent paint scheme.
- Chrome side flashing.
- Burr walnut internal woodwork.
- Fine single panel Vaumol leather upholstered seats in the signature grey/black piping finish.
- Picnic tables to the rear seats.
- Rear armrest to store cigars.
- Sliding sunshine roof.
- Rear side armrests cut down to accommodate the storage of two thermos flasks.
- Festoon lighting under the dashboard for better cabin illumination.

This car has had the body professionally rebuilt including new timber work where needed and extensive new metal sections and has been resprayed in a Nissan colour to match as far as possible the original colour.

It comes with the original engine which has had the head reconditioned as well as a rebuilt DB18/2 engine that can be fitted into the car. There are pale grey leather hides purchased by the previous owner as well as a wiring harness ready to be fitted.

The car will need finishing off, new headlining, servicing and recommissioning of the rod brakes and is on 4 good Michelin radial tyres. The photo of the dark blue car is of one of the roadworthy examples in the UK.

This is a charming, and very attractive pre war Daimler that displays all the best materials and is very rare. There are probably no more than 6 Daimler Ritz examples left, of which only three currently are road worthy. It is the only known Ritz in Australia, having been a private import by the first owner.




We drove around the property in the car, and I was shown the workings of this property. I will be forever indebted to my host for the fulfilment of my desire.
