1939 DB18/1 DAIMLER RITZ FOR SALE

Daimler first produced a medium sized chassis in 1934, and called it the Fifteen. That evolved to the DB17 1 and 2 and then the DB18/1 by 1938/39.

In 1939 a wealthy Sydney Doctor ordered a DB 18/1 and because she did not like black cars, chose an iridescent silver blue Ritz version of the DB 18/1.

The Ritz was a luxury edition of the standard DB 18/1 saloon, and appeared in both six light and four light sports saloon guise. This car, a four light features the Ritz options as follows:

- Heavily plated engine components.
- Iridescent paint scheme.
- Chrome side flashing.
- Burr walnut internal woodwork.
- Fine single panel Vaumol leather upholstered seats in the signature grey/black piping finish.
- Picnic tables to the rear seats.
- Rear armrest to store cigars.
- Sliding sunshine roof.
- Rear side armrests cut down to accommodate the storage of two thermos flasks.
- Festoon lighting under the dashboard for better cabin illumination.

This car has had the body professionally rebuilt including new timber work where needed and extensive new metal sections and has been resprayed in a Nissan colour to match as far as possible the original colour.

It comes with the original engine which has had the head reconditioned as well as a rebuilt DB18/2 engine that can be fitted into the car. There are pale grey leather hides purchased by the previous owner as well as a wiring harness ready to be fitted.

The car will need finishing off, new headlining, servicing and recommissioning of the rod brakes and is on 4 good Michelin radial tyres. The photo of the dark blue car is of one of the roadworthy examples in the UK.

This is a charming, and very attractive pre war Daimler that displays all the best materials and is very rare. There are probably no more than 6 Daimler Ritz examples left, of which only three currently are road worthy. It is the only known Ritz in Australia, having been a private import by the first owner.

I will pencil in a run to Sydney University which would include a tour of the carillion and the Great Hall. So far this is still in the planning stage.


I'm also told that the St James railway tunnel tours may recommence this year. This involves walking under Hyde Park so I will keep that as an option for next year as well.



Part 88 - Fitting The Carpet Part 2

I decided that it was time to continue with the carpeting process. The Firewall carpet had already been cut and only required edging on the sides and around the transmission cover. The vinyl sides were easy enough to sew, but the area around the transmission cover was difficult because of the right-angle cuts I made in the carpet. However, the final fit against the firewall and transmission cover was good.

The next challenge was to determine how to cut the carpet for the floor. Unlike the carpet for the firewall, I am using a thin underlay under the floor carpet to provide a bridge over the various joints in the surface of the floor left by the sound insulation.

Because of the need to have easy access to the car battery under the passenger front seat and the transmission cover, I decided to have separate front and rear carpets. The front carpet runs from the firewall to a position under the front seat just behind the battery cover. Once again, I used cloth to make a template of the area including the necessary cutouts for the seat runners and transmission cover.


To be on the safe side I transferred the dimensions on the cloth template to the underlay to check the fit. Just as well, as it turned out the cloth was slightly undersize. This was not a problem for the underlay. With a few minor adjustments I was able to cut the carpet, this time slightly oversize and trim it for a perfect fit. Now all the edges must be trimmed with vinyl edging.

Lanchester:


